## THE CEDARS

Historically, the Cedars was among Dallas' first elegant neighborhoods. Named after the forest of cedar and oak trees lining its streets, the Cedars became home to some of Dallas' great leaders. Business thrived and many of our streets were lined with beautiful Victorian homes — it was an area where many people lived and worked. Eventually industry took over and the homes disappeared.

With changing times and growing suburbs, the area declined; but now with the visions of urban pioneers, growth of public transportation and city support, the area is experiencing a major urban renewal.

The Cedars is quickly evolving into a major eclectic music mecca and night spot with many popular music venues, restaurants, clubs and bars. Dozens of artists and craftsmen live and work in renovated warehouses and loft spaces. A residential boom is also underway, with lofts, condominiums and other alternative spaces popping up in new construction and renovated buildings.

## THE TOUR

Art and artists, along with the times, are always changing, new materials to work with, new experiences, and new ideas.

Once a year, artists and businesses of the Cedars open their doors to give visitors a chance to really experience a creative evolving neighborhood, rich in art, history, dining and entertainment.

Meet the artists who live and work in the Cedars. See where they work and what they create. And of course, there's always the opportunity to find the perfect piece to take home with you. All funding for the tour comes from the neighborhood — check out what we've got!

If you've never been to the Cedars, now is a great chance to learn about the neighborhood — an evolving work of art in itself.

## GETTING AROUND

**BY CAR** from I-30, exit S. Ervay or S. Lamar and head south on S. Lamar, S. Akard, S. St. Paul or S. Harwood streets. You are here!

**FREE PARKING** available at Dallas Heritage Village, South Side on Lamar, Corinth Park or at any artist studio. Look for "P" on the map.

**DART RAIL** to Cedars Station and walk to South Side on Lamar (map 7). See the sights then catch a ride around the area on a shuttle.

**BUS SHUTTLE** is a fun, free and casual way to tour the studios. Shuttles starting from Dallas Heritage Village will circulate among the participating artists and businesses throughout the day.

**BIKE TOUR** from the gates of Dallas Heritage Village (map 1) at 10 a.m. or 2 p.m. Tour the Cedars Open Studios led by a neighborhood guide.
